Children among 32 killed in Gaza on 3rd day of Eid Al-Adha

MI News Service, Gaza: At least 36 Palestinians were killed, including children, and dozens were injured as the Israeli army continued its genocidal attacks across the Gaza Strip on the third day of Eid al-Adha, one of Islam's holiest festivals. Eight people were killed in an Israeli airstrike on a home in the town of Jabalia in the northern Gaza Strip, the official Palestinian news agency Wafa reported. Earlier, the local Al-Aqsa Radio reported that Israeli strikes on displaced people's homes and tents in Khan Younis killed 10 Palestinians, including children. In western Rafah, 13 Palestinians were killed as the Israeli army struck them near an aid distribution site of the Israeli-American Gaza Humanitarian Foundation, according to the local broadcaster. One more Palestinian was killed near another aid distribution site in the Netzarim Corridor area in the central Gaza Strip, the Palestinian broadcaster added. The Israeli army also killed four Palestinians and wounded others in a drone strike that targeted a group of civilians in Khan Younis. The army, meanwhile, continued to blow up homes and buildings in the Jabalia area and eastern Gaza City, according to witnesses. This marks the fourth Eid for Gazans since October 2023, when Israel launched a genocidal war that killed nearly 54,900 Palestinians, created famine conditions and rendered the enclave uninhabitable.

Officials demolish four UP mazars over 'illegal construction'

MI News Service, Bahraich: Four "illegal" mazars, including the prominent Lakkar Shah Baba mazar, located in the core area of the Katarniaghat Wildlife Sanctuary in Uttar Pradesh's Bahraich district, were demolished, an official said on Monday, June 9. Divisional Forest Officer (DFO) B Shivshanker told reporters that the action was taken the previous day under provisions of the Forest Conservation Act, 1980. "The shrines of Lakkar Shah, Bhawar Shah, Chaman Shah, and Shahn Shah were situated in beat number 20 of the Murthi Range. These mazars lie within forest land. Though the mazar committee submitted a copy of a 1986 Waqf Board registration, they failed to provide any legal evidence of ownership or land rights," he said. The press briefing was held at the Collectorate auditorium, with district magistrate Monika Rani and the Superintendent of Police in attendance. Shivshanker said that under the Forest Conservation Act, an approval from the Centre is mandatory for non-forestry use of forest land, which was not obtained in this case. "Hence, the structures were declared encroachments and demolished accordingly," he said. The DFO said that the mazar committee had earlier moved the high court against the department's actions, but could secure no relief. Forest staff, Special Tiger Protection Force, local police, and Provincial

Armed Constabulary have been deployed at the site to prevent any confrontation leading to law and order breakdown, he said. Asked why the media was kept off the demolished site, Shivshanker said, "The area falls in a jungle zone where the presence of wild animals could lead to human-wildlife conflict, hence access was restricted." District Magistrate Monika Rani, however, directed that mediapersons may be allowed limited access to the site under the forest officials' supervision. Israr, secretary of the mazar committee, told reporters that the Lakkar Shah Baba shrine had been hosting the annual urs since the 16th century, which the forest department recently banned. "We are considering approaching the high court against this act by the forest department," he said. Last month, the district administration also imposed restrictions, citing security reasons, on the annual fair held at the famous Sayyad Salar Masud Ghazi dargah in Bahraich. Earlier, when the department stopped the annual fair at the mazar, shrine management committee president Raim Ahmad had said the dargah symbolised Hindu-Muslim unity, with almost 60 per cent of the visitors being Hindu. "Fairs have been held here for centuries. The same forest department that used to auction contracts and issue work orders is now calling it encroachment," he said.

Israel says body of Hamas commander Mohammed Sinwar recovered from Gaza tunnel

MI News Service, Jerusalem: The Israeli military said that it had recovered the body of Mohammed Sinwar, head of Hamas' military wing, from a tunnel in the southern Gaza Strip and taken it to Israel. In a statement, the military said on Sunday that following an identification process, it had confirmed that "the body of Mohammed Sinwar was located in the underground tunnel route beneath the European Hospital in Khan Younis." Sinwar and Muhammad Shabaneh, commander of Hamas' Rafah Brigade, were killed in the tunnel on May 13 by the Israeli military and the Shin Bet intelligence agency, the statement said. The bodies were found during a raid in the area that began on Wednesday under heavy airstrikes. The raid was still ongoing, Xinhua news agency reported. "During searches in the underground tunnel route, several items belonging to Sinwar and Shabaneh were located, along with additional intelligence findings that were transferred for further investigation," it said, without providing further details. Additional bodies were recovered during the operation, and their identities are under examination, the military added. In late May, the Israeli military first said Sinwar had been killed in an airstrike. Gaza health authorities said the strike killed at least six people and wounded 40. Sinwar, 49, was described by the Israeli military as one of Hamas' most senior and long-serving commanders, playing a central role in the October 7, 2023 attack on Israel. He was the younger brother of Yahya Sinwar, the former Hamas leader in Gaza, who was killed by the Israeli military in October 2024. Israeli attacks have continued to claim Palestinian lives, bringing the death toll in the enclave to 54,880 since October 2023, Gaza's health authorities announced on Sunday, adding 126,227 others have been injured.

Sealdah Division conducts awareness campaign to curb plastic use and promote Eco-Friendly practices



MI News Service, Kolkata: In alignment with the global theme #EndPlasticPollution, Eastern Railway's Sealdah Division has undertaken a major initiative to promote eco-friendly alternatives and reduce the use of single-use plastic at railway premises recently. The Environment and Housekeeping Management (EnHM) Department conducted a large-scale awareness and cleanliness campaign across various stations of the division. The campaign encouraged passengers and vendors to adopt sustainable practices, including the use of personal water bottles in place of disposable plastic ones. Public Address (PA) systems are being actively used to inform passengers about the harmful effects of single-use plastic and to seek their cooperation in limiting its use. Additionally, train service providers and onboard vendors have been encouraged to replace plastic products with recycled and eco-friendly alternatives in catering and related services.

Iran ready for inspection of nuclear facilities: President Pezeshkian

MI News Service, Tehran: Iranian President Masoud Pezeshkian said that his country is ready for inspection of its nuclear facilities, but does not accept coercion. Pezeshkian made the remarks in a meeting, on Saturday, with Kazakhstan's Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Murat Nurtleu in the Iranian capital Tehran while commenting on the ongoing indirect nuclear talks between Tehran and Washington, according to a statement published on the website of his office. He said that Iran's nuclear activities were completely "transparent," and the International Atomic Energy Agency had confirmed it repeatedly, Xinhua news agency reported. "As we are ready for inspections, we consider as unacceptable any deprivation of nations of knowledge, technology and scientific achievements," he said, adding that Iran was always ready to listen to logical discourse but would never accept "coercion and bullying." The Kazakh foreign minister, for his part, expressed his country's respect for Iran's "principled and logical" positions on peaceful nuclear activities. Nurtleu submitted a written message from Kazakh President Kassym-Jomart Tokayev to Pezeshkian. Nurtleu said he hoped the message would "open a new chapter in the two countries' relations." The two sides agreed to promote bilateral relations in all areas, according to the statement. The Kazakh foreign minister arrived in Tehran on Saturday morning and was welcomed by his Iranian counterpart Seyed Abbas Araghchi, the official news agency IRNA reported. They held a meeting on bilateral and regional issues later in the day and signed a memorandum of understanding on cooperation in the field of diplomatic archives. Iran and the United States have held five rounds of Oman-mediated indirect talks starting from April on Tehran's nuclear program and the lifting of US sanctions.

16 arrested for illegal cattle slaughter during Eid, says Assam CM

MI News Service, Dispur: Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma on Sunday, June 7, said 16 individuals had been arrested for illegally slaughtering cattle during Eid-ul-Zuha. The arrests followed reports of cattle parts being recovered from multiple locations across the state, sparking communal tensions in some areas. Sarma stated that five unauthorised slaughter sites were identified in the Barak Valley region — specifically in Gumrah, Silchar, and Lakhimpur in Cachar district, and Badarpur and Banga in Karimganj district. Tensions escalated in Hajoji, where members of the Hindu community staged road blockades after allegedly finding pieces of meat scattered in residential areas on Saturday night. In response, Muslim residents also blocked roads, leading to a confrontation. Police had to intervene using mild lathi-charge to disperse the protesters and restore order. A senior police officer confirmed that additional paramilitary forces have been deployed in sensitive areas to maintain peace. CM Sarma emphasized that while the Constitution guarantees religious freedom, it also mandates adherence to the rule of law. "Disturbing incidents of illegal cattle slaughter and recovery of cattle parts were reported from various parts of Assam. A total of 16 people have been arrested — nine from Cachar and seven from Sribhumi," Sarma said in a post on X. The Assam Cattle Preservation Act, 2021, prohibits the slaughter of cattle and sale of beef in areas predominantly inhabited by Hindus, Jains, or Sikhs, and within a five-kilometre radius of temples or sarats (Vaishnavite monasteries). While beef consumption itself is not banned in Assam, the act strictly regulates where and how cattle can be slaughtered.

Israel seizes Gaza-bound aid ship Madleen with Greta Thunberg on board

MI News Service, Jerusalem: Israeli forces stopped a Gaza-bound aid boat and detained Greta Thunberg and other activists who were on board early Monday, enforcing a longstanding blockade of the Palestinian territory that has been tightened during the war with Hamas. The Freedom Flotilla Coalition, which had organised the voyage to deliver humanitarian aid to the Gaza Strip and protest Israel's blockade and wartime conduct, said the activists had been "kidnapped by Israeli forces" and released pre-recorded messages from them. "The ship was unlawfully boarded, its unarmed civilian crew abducted, and its life-saving cargo — including baby formula, food and medical supplies — confiscated," it said in a statement.
